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

STUDENT SPOTLIGHT STORIES



Choir students and sisters **Anabel and Isabel** have grown into confident leaders. Anabel shares, **"Music helps me let go of my shyness. I got the opportunity to be the emcee at a school concert and I was nervous, but music class helped me prepare for and enjoy it."** Isabel adds, **"Since I've been singing, I feel more confident in myself."**

Isabel and Anabel's mother, Ana expresses, **"Music class has given the girls an opportunity to be leaders. They share experiences, offer help and support to classmates, and at the same time ask for help when needed."**



Annika, an Orchestra Student, is discovering her purpose and sense of self. Annika shares, **"I really like playing the cello because it makes me feel like me. Learning music makes me feel really good and it tells me that I need to relax...it makes me feel better. Everyone has something to give to the world, and for me, it's music."**

Annika's music teacher, Mrs. Cahuantzi shares, **"As a leader in the orchestra, Annika is thoughtful, intelligent, and a role model. I see her dedication, consistency, and attention to detail in music transfer to her life beyond the classroom."**



Harmony's connection with music is more than notes on a page. **"Without music, others and I wouldn't be able to express our emotions and feelings,"** she explains. This sense of expression, along with the fun and creativity she finds in music, has transformed her school experience. **"Music has changed my life,"** she confides.

Her father, José shares, **"She's constantly stretching her brain by memorizing songs and choreography, which is great for building memory and focus. Plus, music class fosters teamwork and communication with her classmates—skills that will benefit her in all aspects of life. The school concerts are a highlight. It's fantastic to see her perform with her classmates and witness the joy in everyone's faces."**

COMMUNITY & PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT



Throughout the school year, our devoted teaching staff and guests worked tirelessly to refine and develop their roles as music educators. ETM-LA provided **over 100 hours of training**, which included our intensive week-long Summer Training Academy, October Training Academy, Winter Training Academy, Spring Training Academy, and other workshops and seminars to support our educators in their professional journey.

The goal of empowering under-served children never left sight as our teachers explored strategies on how to be culturally responsive, nurture under-resourced communities, engage all students, and embrace creativity in their music classroom and lessons.

Our principals and district leaders had even more chances for growth at the **15th Annual Principals Leadership Conference**. Every year, leaders are encouraged to share, learn, and thoughtfully plan for ways to successfully

explore and implement music programs across schools, districts, and local communities. One principal shared, **"I want to understand my own voice as an administrator and give a voice to my students and staff."** Other feedback from participants included: **"Speakers were very effective in really making you focus on our music program and how to expand it."**

Annually, ETM-LA's program team attends the **California All-State Music Educators Conference (CASMEC)**, hosted by The California Music Educators Association (CMEA) a unit of the National Association for Music Education (NAfME).

Formosa Group Worldwide Interactive Paul Lipson (presented to Schmidt).

During a video tribute in memoriam of ETM-LA Advisory Board Member and legendary Disney composer **Richard M. Sherman**, the attendees joined in a heartwarming singalong of "It's a Small World."



FAMILY HOUR SERIES A SUCCESS

DREAMWORKS ANIMATION'S *ABOMINABLE AND THE INVISIBLE CITY*



On March 6, 2025, ETM-LA continued its Family Hour Series, exploring DreamWorks Animation's *Abominable and The Invisible City* with the classrooms of ETM-LA Partner Schools. ~2,000 students tuned in to enjoy a behind-the-scenes look into the creative process for the film with director **Ruolin Li** (Nickelodeon Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles) and artist **Amelia Kasten** (Nancy Drew), alongside a collaborative demonstration led by

actor **Karen Huie** (Nancy Drew) who voiced the character Nai Nai, while Kasten live animated the reading. Composer **George Shaw** (*Escape the Night, Star Wars Musical*) unpacked his music composition process for the students. Students learned how Shaw incorporated cultural instruments into his composition to blend western and eastern sounds. They also enjoyed seeing video clips of the recording session for the main theme on violin.

DREAMWORKS ANIMATION'S *THE WILD ROBOT*



ETM-LA developed its Family Hour Series even further on May 15th, 2025, with DreamWorks Animation's *The Wild Robot* and ~2,500 student attendees from across LA County. Participants explored the film's collaborative storyboard, musical, and animation process with Academy Award-Winning Composer **Kris Bowers** (*The Last Repair Shop, Bridgerton*), Score Coordinator **Sahil Jindal** (*Haunted*

Mansion, Bob Marley: One Love) and Head of Story **Heidi Jo Gilbert** (*Puss in Boots: The Last Wish, Turbo*) to illuminate art's ability to communicate emotions. Bowers provided a look into the music of *The Wild Robot*, sharing clips from the film to show how music amplified messages of community, motherhood, & kindness. Students then enjoyed an interactive drawing lesson guided by Gilbert.

15TH ANNUAL MUSIC UNITES THE WORLD FESTIVAL

On March 12-13, 2025, ETM-LA hosted the **15th Annual Music Unites the World Festival**, at the Saban Theater in Beverly Hills, where students received training from renowned artists and educators. The culminating concert brought together over 1,200 friends, family, and ETM-LA partner school students.

On Day 1, instrumental ensembles from **ETM-LA's partner schools** performed with guidance from **Claudio Alcantar** (Music Director & Music Teacher), **Anthony White** (Award-Winning Band Director), **Angel Velez** (Conductor & Orchestrator), **Brooke DeRosa** (Award-Winning Composer & Conductor), and **Rachael Denny** (Dept. Chair, Pasadena Conservatory of Music). **John Dennis** (Executive Creative Director, Music, Disney Imagineering) shared a reassuring message with attendees about encouraging music education and helping children find and follow their passion.

Festival Day 2 welcomed student choirs, rock bands, and Orff ensembles, who diligently

prepared culturally diverse songs for their respective concerts. Ensembles on the second day received training from **Baraka May** (Vocalist & Choral Conductor), **Jenny Tisi** (Choral Director), **Misha Shtangrud** (Choral Director), **Richard Lawton** (Music Professor), and **Tony Sauza** (ETM-LA Instructional Supervisor).

Angel Velez (Conductor & Orchestrator) gave a speech to students about how music is a catalyst for exploring the world and sharing positivity. In a grand finale, **Masanga Marimba** led the festival goers in a joyful dance party celebrating music from Africa and Latin America.

ETM-LA also publicly awarded two student essay contest winners, **Amy Alonso** and **Chris Angel**, who both shined in articulating how music allows us to work hard, express ourselves, and unlock our potential.



SUMMER MUSIC PROGRAM



Though school was officially out for the summer, the music kept playing as students from across ETM-LA partner schools attended this year's two-week **Summer Music Program**. Students eagerly took part in string ensemble, band, singing, and general music with a diverse mix of musical genres including blues, classical, film, pop, and rock.

Led on-site by Music Teacher Mentor **Lucy Cahuantzi**, students loved working with ETM-LA Music Teachers **Ariel Ortega**, **Ricardo Rodriguez**, and **Ryan Fogal**, who had added support from ETM-LA volunteers and student alumni. Each day was filled with musical warm-ups, fun games, and ensemble rehearsals.

Mrs. Cahuantzi shared, "I am very proud of how students supported each other and found joy in making music together. It was more than just learning notes; it was about connection, expression, and community."

On the last day, families joined together to perform music from the Blues, **The Beach Boys**, **Justin Timberlake**, and **Julie London**, to **John Williams' Star Wars** and **Jurassic Park**, concluding in a combined choir and instrumental piece, "Mr. Blue Sky" by **The Electric Light Orchestra**. A parent noted, "My child loved the summer program and got to explore music theory, learn fun, challenging songs, and make new friends! He's excited to come back next summer!"
